ear Alumni, In 2017, we will celebrate 25 years since the founding of KIMEP University, a momentous occasion not only in the history of the university, but in the history of an independent Kazakhstan. As we prepare for this major milestone, I would like to take a moment to reflect on some of our most outstanding accomplishments throughout the years.

As the first English-language University in the CIS, KIMEP was established with a unique vision to create a culture based on meticulous care for the well-being of our students. The founding principles are transparency, integrity, and zero tolerance to corruption. All KIMEP's efforts are founded on this vision and by rigorously safeguarding it, the university has earned an outstanding reputation in Kazakhstan and Central Asia.

Quality education has always been at the heart of this university. Attracting exceptional faculty from a wide range of fields spanning more than 27 countries, KIMEP has set the standard for educational excellence early on and continues to be the industry benchmark both locally and internationally. To maintain academic excellence, KIMEP supports, celebrates and rewards outstanding teaching and scholarship. A priority is being placed upon improving faculty salaries to strengthen retention of current faculty and to enhance KIMEP University's ability to attract new qualified and reputable faculty. Despite external economic challenges, KIMEP University increased international faculty salaries including fringe benefits to, on average 37% for the 2016-2017 academic year. For the following year, we are projecting an across-the-board salary increment of 25% staying true to our commitment to offer compensation packages competitive to western universities.

From 1994 to 2016, KIMEP University produced more than 11,000 highly qualified graduates. With strong employer relationships, KIMEP maintains the best record in the country for employment of its graduates with 95% of our graduates finding gainful employment within six months of graduation. From employers' perspective, KIMEP University enjoys a high satisfaction regarding placements. During their studies, KIMEP University students gain meaningful employment and leadership experience preparing them for success in the job market. Therefore, many multinational companies, such as AirAstana, Deloitte, Ernst & Young, KPMG, Mars and PWC almost exclusively recruit KIMEP graduates.

KIMEP University is also proud of the active role that students play in the decision-making process. Students are represented in all key committees, and the university's administration regularly consults with the KIMEP Student Association, which serves as the elected student government.

During the anniversary year, KIMEP University has started two important initiatives to further improve the quality of education and the well-being of students on campus. The first major step to achieving that is an ambitious global recruiting effort KIMEP initiated this year to fill more than 20 faculty positions. Advertising vacancies in Tier-1 media, such as The Economist and The Guardian, as well as top recruiting websites for academics KIMEP University has devoted substantial resources to ensure highest quality of education. The second step is a large-scale renovation of campus facilities. This will include a full renovation of the Great Hall, restoration of the exterior and interior facades, and improvements to create more usable green space at the heart of the campus.

Many departments and teams at the University together with student leaders are involved in the preparation of the 25th anniversary celebration for all alumni and their families, students, faculty, staff, and friends of KIMEP. I hope that many of you – no matter where you are in the world – will use this momentous occasion to renew your connections with this University and return to our beautiful campus.

Many of you stay connected with KIMEP University through the friendships you've made. You also give back to our community in meaningful ways – from providing scholarship opportunities to students in need to making a difference by teaching at your alma mater. It is precisely this sincere dedication to lifelong learning and growth that makes KIMEP graduates and KIMEP University a shining example for Kazakhstan, Central Asia, and indeed the world.

Building on the dedication of KIMEP alumni, in this issue of the Alumni Magazine we have collected stories of your impact on the University honoring your multiple contributions to our great community.

I hope you will be inspired by the stories in this anniversary issue. I look forward to seeing many of you during the anniversary events to celebrate the legacy we have built together.

UNIVERSITY NEWS AND EVENTS

News from BCB

BCB started fall 2016 semester with a new dean, Dr. Sang Hoon Lee (Professor of Finance), who replaced the former dean, Dr. Ha Jin Hwang who took one-year leave of absence at the end of spring 2016. Dr. Lee previously served BCB twice as Dean, during 2007-10 and 2012-13.

BCB's student registration statistics showed a continuous growth trend following the growth trend of two consecutive semesters from the last fall 2015 and spring 2016. Although the current economic conditions are not favorable for attracting new students, BCB proved again its superior quality that its business education is still the most relevant and favored by both students and employers.

To provide our students more skills for good business judgment, BCB plans to reinforce its "Practice-based" business education from fall 2016 by incorporating more industry inputs and experimental learning mode into its curriculum.

BCB produced two additional DBAs (Doctor of Business Administration) in fall 2016, Dr. Olga Pak and Dr. Maya Katenova, both finance majors. In spring 2016, BCB produced two Accounting DBAs, Dr. Rashid Makarov and Dr. Nulan Orazalin. Both Olga and Maya investigated issues in banking industry for their dissertations, and successfully defended their doctoral thesis at the end of the summer session. With the doctoral degrees on hand, they will be promoted to Assistant Professors of Finance from spring 2017.

In September 2016, BCB was visited by Dr. Yamaguchi from Yamagata University in Japan for research cooperation with BCB faculty. BCB held a discussion with him for further improvement of the relationship including student and faculty exchanges. In early October, a group of delegates from Penn State University visited KIMEP, and BCB engaged in a discussion with the U.S. university on the development of international relations and research cooperation.

BCB along with CSS will install Bloomberg terminals for business and economics students to experiment a stock-trading system and access to financial and economic data and information for their research and study. This type of technology adaptation will help our students to improve their necessary job skills and secure quality jobs.

BCB will continue and improve its relationships with external organizations such as ACCA, ICAEW, CMA, CFA, and other professional institutions to help our students in passing professional exams and promote KIMEP's image in international circle.

It has been a goal of Konstantinos's work to break down the barriers to student literacy, for students & tutors, by examining the tacit academic culture that is implicit in the genre (& teaching) of a discipline, through the use of concepts from the Communities of Practice model.

MA TESOL Program by Dinara Karimova, MA TESOL 2014

In 2014, I graduated from KIMEP University with a MAFL diploma. This program has definitely influenced my professional life in many positive ways! First, I learned more about different theoretical and practical aspects of teaching and learning English as a foreign language from the enthusiastic faculty members with multicultural backgrounds. The Department of International Academic Mobility (DIAM) initiates and administers partnerships with universities and other organizations both abroad and within Kazakhstan.

As of today KIMEP University has 160 partnerships that cover cooperative activities in the sphere of academic mobility, summer programs, research, dual degrees, information and experience exchange.

In 2015-206 the large international family of the University expanded to 15 new universities and 2 international organizations – all this for the purpose of mobility programs, trainings, research and experience exchange between students, faculty and staff.

Among those partners 12 European universities have established direct partnerships with KIMEP University under Erasmus + Program funded by European Union. Such agreements set up strategic sustainable partnerships with such universities as Thomas Bata University, Zlin (Czech Republic), Tartu University (Estonia), National University of Public Affairs (Hungary), Iceland University (Iceland), Lichtenstein University (Lichtenstein), University of Las Palmas De Gran Canaria (Spain), Lund University (Sweden) and others with mutual exchange taking place for 1-2 semesters for students and for 7-14 days for faculty and staff.

In 2015-16 about 260 students went abroad through external mobility program for study periods of 2-4 weeks to 2 semesters to 21 country, including Denmark, Austria, Bulgaria, UK, Hungary, Hong Kong, Spain, Italy, China, Latvia, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Republic of Korea, Singapore, Slovenia, France, Croatia, Czech Republic, Sweden, Estonia. Many students received grants both from Erasmus+ Program and directly from our partners.

67 students from partner universities studied in KIMEP through external and internal academic mobility from Kazakhstan and 16 countries, such as Korea, Austria, Azerbaijan, UK, Germany, Hong Kong, Spain, China, Netherlands, Norway, Singapore, Slovakia, Turkey, France.

For the third year in a row already on 2015-16 KIMEP University becomes a platform for hosting a long-term program – the first module of Executive MBA program in Development of Policies and Practices, IHEID with Geneva Institute of Graduate Studies, Switzerland. The program is administered jointly by faculty members from Geneva and KIMEP for participants from CIS countries, thus making a valuable contribution into development of human potential of those countries and of Kazakhstan itself.

Short-term programs for 25 students of Singapore National University and for 15 students of Hong Kong College of Technologies also contributed to dynamism of summer programs on campus.

16 faculty and staff members went abroad to read lectures, conduct research and share experience in such universities as Neubrandenburg University of Applied Sciences (Germany), University of Las Palmas De Gran Canaria (Spain), Tartu University (Estonia), Varna University (Bulgaria), Ljubljana University (Slovenia), Ferrara University (Italy), Madison University (USA), Uppsala University (Sweden). Many of them obtained mobility scholarships through Erasmus+ Program.

3 professors from Lund University (Sweden), Deusto University (Spain) and from Uppsala University (Sweden) spent up to 3 weeks in KIMEP University through academic mobility, giving guest lectures in International Relations program and teaching English.

Starting with several participants back in 2002, in AY 2015-16 already KIMEP had 386 international students out of the total number of 2872 people of student population. KIMEP has established active partnerships with more than 80 universities globally and 30 of them are included into the list of world's top universities in 2015. Just several names may serve as examples of this: Seoul National University (Korea), Graz University (Austria), Strasbourg University (France), Amsterdam University (Netherlands), Lund University (Sweden), Humboldt University (Germany) Hong Kong Baptist University (China), Yonsei University (Korea) Bilkent University (Turkey), Glasgow University (UK), Lausanne University (Switzerland).

In AY 2015-2016 we developed a dual degree MBA program with ESC School of Business of Rennes, France. So, today KIMEP University offers 14 dual degree undergraduate and graduate programs with 9 partner universities. In AY 2015-16 KIMEP hosted 4 graduate students from Glasgow University, who studied under the dual degree program in International Relations. One graduate student from KIMEP went to Humboldt University, Germany, under a dual degree program in Economics.

KIMEP UNIVERSITY ALUMNI OF 2006-2015 EMPLOYMENT HIGHLIGHTS

On the eve of KIMEP University's 25th anniversary we would like to present for your kind attention KIMEP alumni employment highlights for the period of 2006-2015.

KIMEP University is committed to working towards rigorous systems, policies and procedures that ensure delivery of a high quality education for students, and maintains graduate employment rate through networking with main employers. To implement this, it puts in place measures to continually assess and evaluate its performance, through an independent corporate unit - Office of Quality Assurance and Institutional Research (QAIR).

QAIR carries out surveys and reviews of KIMEP University's activities and provides detailed analyses for senior management, individual departments and other interested parties. Working in partnership with the academic colleges, schools, centers and administrative departments, QAIR ensures that KIMEP University offers high quality services to its students. As such KIMEP students are surveyed on a rotating basis at their each major milestone:



The feedbacks are captured on quality of teaching, learning experience, level of satisfaction with academic and non-academic services provided by the University. So, one of such tools of monitoring the quality of services is KIMEP Alumni Survey.

KIMEP Alumni Survey is conducted each summer one year after students' graduation. It collects data on alumni employment outcomes, level of satisfaction with the quality of education and serves as valuable source for university-wide and program-based improvements.

Survey history

In 2004, QAIR for the first time conducted KIMEP Alumni Survey among the graduates of academic years 1994-2003. It was agreed that KIMEP would survey classes of 1994-2003 as one bunch due to the relatively young age of the University and the relatively modest number of alumni.

Since 2005, it was decided that the survey would be conducted annually on a regular basis.

Questionnaire

The KIMEP Alumni Survey questionnaire was compiled drawing on examples from several North American Universities under supervision of Dr. Simon Tai, chair of finance department, who had extensive previous experience in conducting alumni surveys in the USA. The questionnaire consisted of four sections covering personal and employment information, program effectiveness and alma mater relations.

Since then the questionnaire underwent only slight changes keeping its main focus on employment, quality of education and involvement with KIMEP University.

Alumni of 2006-2015 Survey results

KIMEP alumni surveys were conducted during summer time by means of e-mails, phone interviews and since 2012 - via online instrument.


During the survey period certain part of alumni was unreachable due to changed e-mail addresses and mobile phone numbers. So, the response rate was calculated out of the number of alumni reached through available contacts. The response rate of alumni respondents fluctuates between 55% (graduates of 2006) and 86% (graduates of 2008).

At the time of the survey the overall share of employed alumni comprised over 80%, with the highest employment rate of 89% occurring among the graduates of 2006 and lowest rate of 77% - among the graduates of 2008 (graph 1).



More than half of graduates of almost all years, except alumni of 2009 and 2010, were employed during their studies at KIMEP University or found job less than a month after graduation. The second largest share of alumni of all years (30%-44%) got employed within six months after leaving the alma mater (graph 2). Such short period of job seeking shows the high demand for KIMEP University alumni on labor market.

Graph 2. Time spent for finding a job




Alumni of 2006, 2007 and 2015 mainly worked in foreign companies while the graduates of the other years were employed in companies with local ownership. The largest share of graduates of all years, except alumni of 2014, held middle and above middle level positions in a year after graduation from the University (graphs 3 and 4). Thus, more than half of KIMEP University graduates enter the work force holding managerial and avoiding the entry level positions.


Graph 3. Ownership of the company

Top three industries employing the majority of KIMEP alumni are Auditing, Banking/Finance/Insurance and Oil/Gas/Mining. In graduates' opinion, the fact of being a KIMEP graduate and area of specialization at KIMEP are the most important factors helping to get their first job after graduation.

The overwhelming majority of the listed aspects on professional preparedness like research, speaking, writing, problem-solving, communication skills, time-management, etc., provided by KIMEP education, as well as aspects on academic study like knowledge of English, knowledge of theory in major, quality of KIMEP courses and teaching at KIMEP, are evaluated by alumni higher than 4 out of 5 maximum.

To sum up, KIMEP alumni are satisfied with their study at KIMEP and 90% of all respondents show their commitment to alma mater by recommending KIMEP to prospective students acknowledging high quality of education and sharing opinion of KIMEP as the best HEI in Kazakhstan.

News from Grants Manager

Dear friends.

Let me introduce last news about scholarships that we managed to get for KIMEP's students and with that I am proud of.

In 2015-2016 academic year KIMEP' students participated in the competition for the scholarship of KAZENERGY Association, which is an association of companies of oil and gas sector, for the first time. 46 students applied for the scholarship



and finally we got 40 scholarships which covered tuition fee of maximum 36 credits per academic year. The total amount of the scholarship was more than KZT 60 million that was contributed by North Caspian Operating Company (NCOC).

During the Awarding Ceremony in January 2016 Dr. Bang, representatives from KAZENERGY Association and PSA LLP awarded fellows with the certificates.

Having such a great experience we decided to think how to keep KAZENERGY scholarship for the next academic year and KIMEP came with the suggestion to support this scholarship with 20% of contribution out of the total amount in case more than 40 students get the grant. Thus, this academic year 60 KIMEP's students out of total 600 applicants from different Kazakhstani universities won scholarships with the total amount of more than KZT 90 million. That was the best achievement of our fundraising work, especially, in this difficult time and taking into account that KIMEP does not belong to oil&gas sector institutions.

I am glad that more students will have financial aid and more students will have the opportunity to get education at KIMEP University. I strongly believe that those people, who once get a financial aid from others, will highly appreciate that chance and in the future they themselves will support other young students at their alma-mater - KIMEP University! Centuplum accipies. I wish you all success!

ALUMNI HIGHLIGHT

Interview with Konstantin Orlov, BAE 2010

Why did you decide to go to KIMEP?

KIMEP always had a high reputation of an excellent university. Since 7th grade I decided that I definitely will try to enter KIMEP. In fact, when I was thinking where to study in 2005-2006, I didn't see better alternative in Kazakhstan for the major I have chosen. I remember that a couple months before entrance examinations I signed up for English preparation courses at KIMEP. Being on campus for the first time was pleasantly surprising for me: clean campus, big territory, students singing songs and playing guitar sitting on the grass. I really liked it and wanted to experience this atmosphere of a student life as soon as possible.

Later I successfully passed my exams and became a part of KIMEP.

What is your most treasured memory about KIMEP?

I have a lot of positive memories from KIMEP. And I think KIMEP's interesting student life is its main difference from other universities in Kazakhstan. All students can show their talents and skills in various student organizations. Since the very first days at KIMEP I felt a special atmosphere and support from the university to develop creative potential of the students. I liked going to different events like ShowTime, KVN, Mister and Miss KIMEP, KELT performances.

Of course, I wanted to join some organizations. Once I was speaking at a presentation on Introduction to marketing course and people from KVN team came to me after the class and offered me to join their team. Later I became a captain of the team. KIMEP administration always supported us, they even provided our team with a classroom where we could meet and write scenario.

Do you have any memories of outstanding professors?

One of the best things in KIMEP is its professional instructors. However, I was amazed by their dedication to work and absolute transparency in grading students. Many professors were understanding and sympathetic, they cared about students. For example, during my first year when I was taking Introduction to Microeconomics class from John Leonard, I got sick. However, I still kept attending all lectures. As a result, I was feeling worse and worse and had a severe cough at my final exam which was bothering me. I bet all people in the class hated me at that moment. I left the exam feeling unsatisfied, blaming myself that I didn't do my best. I've understood that I had to rewrite it to show my actual knowledge.

Three days later I came to the professor to ask him for one more chance to rewrite the exam, but he ensured me saying that I should wait for the results. And I was so surprised when I found out that I got 33% out of 40%. Maybe I wrote the test so good by myself, but I still think that professor John Leonard added a few points, because I thought



I failed it. Somehow I decided to show my gratitude with cognac and chocolate and it shocked me when John Leonard refused to take a standard present we used to give our teachers or doctors. I was 18 and at that time I didn't know that people don't give such presents as a sign of gratefulness in other countries. That was a pleasant surprise and I didn't make such mistakes later.

Some instructors are especially memorable for me. Cristopher White (I've never been so interested in geography as at his classes,) or Dana Bazarkulova, she could explain complicated things by simple language. And also Zhansulu Baikenova who is a very educated and erudite professor.

Where do you work now?

Six months ago I created my own business. It's a Kazakh language center «QazaqStudy». The main advantage of our center is that we teach our students by methods Canadian linguists developed. They have been living in Kazakhstan and learning Kazakh language for several years to find out the most effective method of learning Kazakh using their experience.

How did you start your business?

After graduating from KIMEP I went to Scotland, Edinburgh to continue my education. I got my master degree there and several years worked as an economist and then as a financial analyst. Also, I worked as a head of the financial departments in one of the Kazakhstani investment companies. However, I've never felt satisfaction from what I do. Even with high salary, beautiful office and some future perspectives I didn't enjoy my job. At one moment I realized that it couldn't continue that way and started thinking about opening my own startup.

I decided to open a good Kazakh language center, where people can easily learn how to speak Kazakh. The major difficulty was to find the most effective method of teaching. I spent three months searching for the contacts and then speaking to the huge amount of instructors, businessmen and methodologists, but everything I saw was typical and banal. There were useless exercises, boring tests and millions of vague rules and tables, which students had to learn by heart to speak Kazakh. Luckily, I met these Canadians who lived in Kazakhstan and developed the most effective method to learn Kazakh language. They agreed to share it with me. After opening my center, despite all the difficulties I had, I with certainty can say that my life became much more interesting than before, when I worked for someone else. And I don't have any regrets.

What are your future career path?

I have big plans for expanding our company. We plan to open additional branch offices in Almaty, Astana and other cities of Kazakhstan. Also, we want to do our best in developing Kazakh language in general. Moreover, recently with the group of coders and programmers we started working on online service of learning Kazakh. We hope that it will partially solve the language problem in Kazakhstan.

Do you stay in touch with your classmates?

Almost all my friends are my friends from KIMEP. It's been 6 years after our graduation but we still remain close friends. I think these friends are people with whom I will be friends for a long time.

What would be your advice to current students?

I want to advise you to find out what you truly want to do in your lives as soon as possible. Discover your talents and strongest sides and sharpen your skills. Also, it is important not to afraid to try something new. And of course, I strongly recommend to join various student organizations, because you will find amazing people and gain useful experience.

Interview with Aizhan Suleimenova, BAIJ 2014

Why did you choose KIMEP?

KIMEP University - the only university in Kazakhstan that has best journalism program in English. What we would like say to all students is just that all of us are having our golden time right now. We are not pressed by job during the studies and it is the best time to think and to make plans. Along with that, we are capable of receiving the most valuable information in the world from our professors. It is in our own power to develop ourselves in important directions. It is much harder to do so, to change something in our lives, when we are fully employed. But if you have decided to change something in your life, do so! LIFE is like LEGO. It is you, who defines what to built out of these lego bricks, while the final result depends on your own will and determination. The main thing is the quality of LEGO bricks and definitely the teachers. Perhaps teachers are even more important than the bricks.

About international working experience.

At the moment I have finished an internship in one of Austrian bicycle producers. Being inside of Austrian company for few months I have noticed several interesting things. In Austrian companies the degree of trust is higher than you would expect. It is assumed, that the given task will be accomplished on time and in high quality. On time means that the task will be finished several days before the deadline and there will be an opportunity to discuss it before the official deadline. The primary language of communication is Austrian (dialect of German). Austrian differs from German in pronunciation and by alterations of many simple words. In many cases it means, that words will sound unfamiliar, because they will be shortened and changed in form. The written form is the same as German, so there should not be problems if you know German. But be prepared that Austrian is different from German in daily life.

Management style compared to KZ. Although the described relationships between top management and employees are quite different between Kazakhstan and Austria, it should be mentioned that in Kazakhstan one can find well managed and interesting companies, like here in Austria. The truth is that it of course depends on the industry, but it is true at least for Advertising and Finance industries.

About plans.

Our friends often ask us about the future plans: so you guys left for education, what's next? Will you stay there? We are still in the process of making the decision and can only share our vision to the current date. To start with, we are reading all news about everything that is happening at home, as well as what it is going on here in Austria. When we were leaving the country, we were leaving our good jobs, good salaries and even if the crisis was starting – leaving usual place of living, your motherland is always hard. It is far easier to stay at home. Despite of this, some people search for their chance, then take it and leave! Sometimes it is associated with risks. Our case

was long-weighted decision - we were saving money for studies in order to be capable of doing it all on our own. Now, when you live abroad for over 1 year there are many more opportunities to find a job, get settled and bring your family here. Coming back into our reality looks like a huge challenge. Using your knowledge properly in our (Kazakhstani) reality is obviously harder, than just finding a perfect job here, abroad. Of course, salaries and quality of management in our companies matter as well. So in order to come back and to help your country to make out, you need to be creative - it might take a while to invent something new, to start a new business or do another job. But if you have a goal of doing something for the country, then those obstacles will make your life interesting and adventurous! We do have a goal like that, so in a longterm we plan to come back to Kazakhstan. We have some ideas and it was a challenge of planning the goal realisation at home. It means that we have reassessed the risks, benefits, roles in the society and self-realization. It definitely results in loosing of feeling of safety and even the quality of life is going to drop down, but the feeling of satisfaction is definitely higher at home.

When you live in Kazakhstan, you don't question yourself of many things. After you have lived in Europe, these things become something basic for you and you take it for granted. That is why you are shocked when you return back home. But it does not mean that we cannot create our own reality at home.

Yes, we want to see our children attending Kazakhstani schools and studying with their friends, feeling that they belong to the country. But the truth is that with every currency devaluation, every corrupted takeover of companies it is harder to modify your plans. We keep abreast of all events at home, but for today belief in your country outweighs the wish to stay in a warm and safe place forever. And we are not the only people, who wish to return back and work for the benefit of own country. We have many great examples of our own friends, changing reality step by step. They start their own projects, new businesses, new areas for development. We make no propaganda by saying that everyone should return home straight away after graduation. It all depends on personal values and factors in consideration, whether it is a need to create a family, professional ambitions or priorities about the place to earn 10 000 hours in your field - strategy and values. One can be working for 5-10 years abroad knowing that he or she will come back home after that, or one could go home right after graduation. Finally, one could not leave the country at all. There are some areas and industries in Kazakhstan that allow our people to develop as fast as in Europe or the US. Not everyone needs to leave the country to start new business. As for us, there is no good or bad option, but there is an individual path of every person. We would say

that it is more important not to get into a situation, when you would be glad hearing bad news from Kazakhstan and saying "Do you see? It is so good that we have left the country!" Or on the contrary, being upset about your friends' successes saying "Look, our friend did it at home while we we are doing nothing important here". Wherever we would find ourselves, let it bring us positive emotions and let it bring something positive to the society. We personally see our future closely tied to opportunities in

the motherland. For those, who are interested in the topic, Ermek Tursunov has written a lot about it. Of course, we can not speak for everyone who questioned themselves. This is just our current status quo, which we hope will not change for the worse. By the way, Tursunov himself is a great example of a person who returned and reached international success from home in spite of negative analytics and statistical data of Kazakhstan economy.
