Kang Scholarship

Background

- Most of all, I am really honored to serve KIMEP University and our students.
- Throughout my academic career, I have made <u>donations several times to educational</u> <u>institutions in Korea, and planned to do the same for KIMEP University</u>. Coming to KIMEP four months ago, I now feel that I have fully settled in. It is time to materialize my wish.
- I was born as the first child of my mother whose family name is Kang. But in reality, <u>I</u> was her fourth child she lost three babies before me. My mother has always done her utmost to love me. That is why, <u>as a small token of my gratitude</u>, <u>I use my surname as Park-Kang</u>. To honor my mother's love, I want to establish scholarship programs <u>under her and my name</u>.

Fund

- $\underline{16,500,000 \text{ tenge}} = \underline{9,000,000 \text{ per year}}$ (to be gradually increased) + $\underline{7,500,000}$ (2025-2026)
- Donor and moderator: Dr. Sungju Park-Kang

Objective

- To support KIMEP students and motivate them to become future experts
- To establish the <u>most student-centered scholarship in the world</u> in order to inform the international community of <u>KIMEP's core value and its strength</u>, thereby further consolidating KIMEP's position as a world-class and unique institution. For example, **among three members of the selection committee, two are KIMEP students**.

Program

- Kang Scholarship (\underline{KS}) = $\underline{\mathbf{5} \text{ programs}}$
- KS DPRK (\underline{KSD}) + KS AIR (\underline{KSA}) + KS PSIR (\underline{KSP}) + KS KOREA (\underline{KSK}) + KS SPORT (\underline{KSS})
- 20 working hours per week (5 days): tuition for enrolled students (except for KS SPORT)
- 10 months with **tuition aid of 100,000 tenge monthly** (current student assistants: 72,000)
- <u>10 months</u> with <u>tuition aid of 133,333 tenge monthly for *KSA* (current assistants: 72,000)</u>
- Selection plan for 2025-2026 (subject to change): 10 recipients = 2 + 5 + 1 + 1 + 1

Eligibility

- Currently enrolled KIMEP students
- Minimum level of Korean competency, or MOTIVATION to learn Korean language

- Basic knowledge of *North Korea* and International Relations (IR), or $\underline{MOTIVATION}$ to learn
- Or financial difficulty

Kang Scholarship DPRK (KSD)

- 2,000,000 tenge per year (to be gradually increased)
- Priority: working as a *junior fellow* for 3 credits of independent study (graduate students
- 6). According to the current KIMEP policy, no more than 3 credits can be used for BA and no more than 6 credits for MA/PhD
- Task: works requested by the DPRK Strategic Research Center + publication + Korean
- Submission: planning report (within 30 days, start) + final report (before 30 days, end)

Kang Scholarship AIR (KSA)

- Fund: 4,000,000 tenge per year (to be gradually increased) \rightarrow **11,500,000** (2025-2026)
- Priority: breathing as a *junior fellow* for 3 credits of independent study (graduate students
- 6). According to the current KIMEP policy, no more than 3 credits can be used for BA and no more than 6 credits for MA/PhD
- Task: a targeted grade point average (GPA) that students set themselves + publication
- Submission: planning report (within 30 days, start) + final report (before 30 days, end)

Kang Scholarship PSIR (KSP)

- Fund: <u>1,000,000 tenge per year</u> (to be gradually increased)
- Priority: working as a *junior fellow* for 3 credits of independent study (graduate students
- 6). According to the current KIMEP policy, no more than 3 credits can be used for BA and no more than 6 credits for MA/PhD
- Task: <u>works requested by the moderator (Department of Political Science and International Relations) + publication + *Korean*</u>
- Submission: planning report (within 30 days, start) + final report (before 30 days, end)

Kang Scholarship KOREA (KSK)

- Fund: 1,000,000 tenge per year (to be gradually increased)
- Priority: studying as a *junior fellow* in South Korea and Kazakhstan for 3 credits of independent study (graduate students 6). According to the current KIMEP policy, no more than 3 credits can be used for BA and no more than 6 credits for MA/PhD
- Task: duties at a partner university + publication + *Korean-English*
- Submission: planning report (within 30 days, start) + final report (before 30 days, end) + reflection report of 100 words in *Korean* or 500 words in *English* (within 30 days, return)

Kang Scholarship SPORT (KSS)

- Fund: <u>1,000,000 tenge per year</u> (to be gradually increased)
- Affiliation: KIMEP University

- Priority: exercising as a *junior fellow*
- Task: <u>a preferred type of sports + publication</u>
- Submission: planning report (within 30 days, start) + final report (before 30 days, end)

Application

- Deadline: <u>13 August 2025</u> → First working day: 4 September (subject to change)

- Submission: a) motivation letter of about 500 words, b) CV

Selection process

- Stage 1: <u>Document</u> (motivation letter of about 500 words + CV) \rightarrow result: 19 August (expected)
- Stage 2: Interview (in person) $(21 25 \text{ August}) \rightarrow \text{result: } 29 \text{ August (expected)}$

Required Tasks

Kang Scholarship DPRK (KSD)

1) Work requested by the Center

- Tasks related to the Center/President's Office-sponsored events (e.g. posters).
- Assistance in disseminating the <u>Center-relevant information</u>.
- Tasks related to the Center's library.
- Tasks requested by members of the Center.
- Other tasks related to the <u>Center in general</u>.

2) An article as a sole author or co-author

- Basic training: providing a feedback on Dr. Chan Young Bang's book.
- Publication of an article in <u>preferred outlets</u> by recipients *or* recommended outlets by the <u>moderator</u>. Potential outlets include <u>KIMEP Times</u>, <u>KIMEP Voice</u> or any other KIMEP-related publication platforms. Ideally speaking, <u>student-oriented academic journals</u> would be appropriate: for example, <u>Journal of Student Research</u>, <u>Inquiries</u>, <u>Cambridge Journal of Political Affairs</u>, <u>Chicago Journal of Foreign Policy</u>, <u>Critique</u>, and <u>Butler Journal of Undergraduate Research</u>. It can be a single-authored paper or co-authored paper.
- <u>As a customary</u>, scholarship recipients <u>need to acknowledge Kang Scholarship in their publications</u>.
- Opportunity to publish with the <u>Principal Investigator of the DPRK Center and moderator</u>.

3) Korean language

- To become an expert on North Korea, one should know the Korean language. Otherwise, it would be difficult to read North Korean materials and communicate with Korean people.
- Korean competency does <u>NOT</u> guarantee sound and rigorous research constant training is needed. One can conduct research on North Korea without Korean competency. The moderator has encountered such cases numerous times. While very well-intentioned, their <u>analysis and engagement are rather limited</u>.
- <u>Scholarship recipients should *NOT* follow this step</u>. Thus, recipients must include the <u>language section in their planning and final reports</u> submitted to the moderator (Dr. Kang).
- For instance, it is <u>strongly encouraged</u> to take <u>Korean courses offered at KIMEP (NOT mandatory)</u>. The courses include Beginner, Elementary, Intermediate, and Advanced Korean.

- Or it is <u>strongly encouraged</u> to join the <u>Korean Speaking Club at KIMEP (NOT mandatory)</u>. The meetings usually take place at the Korean Library (Dostyk 207), 4 pm on Friday.
- Apart from that, the moderator will check the relevant progress on a regular basis by <u>initiating conversations in Korean and instructing Korean translations</u>, among others.

Kang Scholarship AIR (KSA)

1) A targeted GPA that students set themselves

- There is <u>NO fixed GPA requirement</u>. If recipients get a <u>targeted GPA that they set themselves</u>, the task is completed.

2) An article as a sole author

- The focus of an article should be on how recipients benefit from Kang Scholarship. Potential outlets include <u>KIMEP Times</u>, <u>KIMEP Voice</u> or any other KIMEP-related publication platforms.

Kang Scholarship PSIR (KSP)

1) Work requested by the moderator

- Tasks related to the Department of Political Science and International Relations
- Assistance in disseminating the Department-relevant information.
- Other tasks related to the Department in general.

2) An article as a sole author or co-author

- Please see above.

3) Korean language

- Please see above.

Kang Scholarship KOREA (KSK)

1) Various duties at a partner university in South Korea and Kazakhstan

- An exchange student is expected to perform their duties at a partner university in an honorable and proactive manner.

2) Korean-English language

- Please see above page 3.
- Recipients' reflection report, within 30 days upon their return, should be written in *Korean* for outgoing students from KIMEP and *English* for incoming students from South Korea.

Kang Scholarship SPORT (KSS)

1) A preferred type of sports

- Recipients should engage in their preferred type of sports.
- <u>As a customary</u>, scholarship recipients <u>need to acknowledge Kang Scholarship</u> whenever necessary.

2) An article as a sole author

- The focus of an article should be on how recipients benefit from Kang Scholarship. Potential outlets include <u>KIMEP Times</u>, <u>KIMEP Voice</u> or any other KIMEP-related publication platforms.
