Dear students,

I am writing to inform you about KIMEP University's plans to implement in-person educational discourse from the summer II semester, contingent on the approval from the Ministry of Education and Science and Ministry of Healthcare.

On Monday April 26th, the highest counsel of KIMEP University—consisting of all deans, directors, and vice presidents—adopted a unanimous resolution to organize and deliver in-person lessons from the summer semester, to fully vaccinated students and professors. The demand from students for in-person classes has been overwhelming, and now that vaccinations have been readily available, we would like to implement in-person education.

Additionally, as of Monday, more than 30 top colleges and universities in the United States, and surely more will follow, are fully reopening campuses, but only to fully vaccinated faculty members, students, and administrators.

We plan that all in-person classes will be conducted with full sanitary and environmental controls: Only fully vaccinated individuals will be permitted on campus; and all precautions will be mandatory, including masks, sanitization, and social distancing.

I expect that our petition to the ministries will receive a response within the next two weeks, and I will inform you again of our university's concrete plans. Please stay safe and healthy.
