Proceedings:

1. The event details

The team members discussed the details of the Spring-2023 student research poster competition such as eligibility criteria, number of participants, budget, types and distribution of prizes, the event program, and guidelines for posters.

Decision: The team agreed on the terms and conditions outlined below.

The competition is open to KIMEP University students who are enrolled on the ARWII course during the semester the competition is taking place. The ARWII course instructors will each hold the right to recommend up to two students to participate in the competition. Approximately 36 (max) students are expected to participate in the event this semester. The poster presentations will be judged on-site by an ad hoc committee (comprised of KIMEP faculty). The committee will pick the top six posters, which means that there will be a single first, two second and three third place award winners chosen from among all participants. The audience members will also have the right to vote for the poster they like. The poster that receives the most amount of votes shall receive an Audience Choice Award. The topics of the presentations vary from social sciences, humanities, languages, to business and management.

The budget

In order to organize the SRPC-2023 successfully a budget of KZT 700,000 is necessary:

- o KZT 500.000 for the prizes
- o KZT 200.000 for a small reception

Additionally, the ARWII team members require the support from the university in relation to the printing of the posters and the issue of certificates to all presenters.

Prizes

- o One 1st place Smartwatch (KZT 130.000)
- o Two 2nd places Earbuds (KZT 160.000)
- o Three 3rd places E-book readers (KZT 150.000)
- o Audience Choice Award KZT 60.000

Poster Set-up	The presenters hang their posters on the display boards with the help of double-sided tape or similar material.	13:30
Poster Session	Authors present their work to the committee members and the guests of the event. Presentations should not exceed seven minutes. The presenters are expected to stand by their posters for the duration of the poster session.	14:00
Authors Reception	The committee members announce the best three projects and award prizes and certificates.	16:40
Poster Removal	The presenters remove their posters. All posters left after the removal period will be discarded.	17:00

Guidelines

The presenters are free to design their own posters provided that they meet the guidelines below.

- Students are expected to present their ARWII projects
- The research projects must be original, previously unpublished.
- All posters should be written in English.
- Posters must be produced as a single sheet exposition
- The poster sizes admissible for the event are A0 and A1
- A section at the top of the poster must contain the Title, Author details, and Affiliation.
- Other must-have sections are the Abstract, Introduction, Methods, Results & Discussion,
 Conclusion, and References
- Citations and References must be formatted in APA 7th edition or Oscola styles.
- Printing should be large enough to read easily from a distance of 1-1.5 meters.

- Posters and handouts (if applicable) must be non-promotional/non-commercial and should not contain brand/proprietary product names or commercial logos/names.
- Presenters are expected to wear formal attire.

Dear Dr Smagulova,

On behalf of the Spring-2023 Academic Reading & Writing II (ARWII) course instructors, I would like to formally appeal for support and funding towards the organization of the Student Research Poster Competition (SRPC) 2023.

The SRPC is a new event being introduced as part of the ARWII course starting from Fall-2017 semester. It is planned to take place at the end of every subsequent semester. The primary purpose of this competition is to popularize research among KIMEP University students. The event is meant to be a culmination and celebration of students' semester-long intellectual effort and would provide a platform for select group of ARWII students to showcase their primary research to a wider public as opposed to their groupmates only. It would also allow instructors and students from across KIMEP University to witness and appreciate great number of research projects in one occasion.

This educational opportunity is open to all KIMEP students who are taking the ARWII course at the time of the event. The CHE instructors teaching the ARWII course the same semester the event is taking place will each hold the right to recommend up to two students to participate in the competition. Approximately 30 students are expected to participate in the event this semester. The poster presentations will be judged on-site by an ad hoc committee (comprised of KIMEP faculty). The committee will pick the top six presentations, which means that there will be a single first, two second and three third place award winners chosen from among all participants. The audience members will also have the right to vote for the poster they like. The poster that receives the most amount of votes shall receive an Audience Choice Award. The preliminary date for the event is Friday, May 5, 2023.

In order to organize the SRPC-2023 successfully we seek funding (KZT 700,000) and support for the event.

- KZT 500.000 for the prizes: 1st place smartwatch, KZT 130.000; two 2nd places wireless earphones KZT 80.000 each; and; three 3rd places KZT 50.000 each; Audience Choice Award KZT 60.000.
- KZT 200.000 for a small reception
- Printing of the posters
- Issue of certificates to all presenters

We are convinced that SRPC is an invaluable, educational opportunity for our students. The experience, skills and benefits that students will receive are long lasting and far reaching.
